Mahmudul Amin

Mr. Mahmudul Amin is an Associate Professor of English, Specialist, and an English materials writer at NCTB. He did his BA (Hons) and MA in English Literature from the Dept. of English, University of Dhaka, and MA (with thesis) in ELT from IML, University of Dhaka. He attended many international conferences at home and abroad. He taught at higher secondary level for more than 15 years. He is a material writer of NCTB and coauthor of the English Grammar & Composition, Class VIII. He also coauthors *Introduction to Linguistics*, *Words in USE*, and *Approaches and Methods of ELT*.



Dr. Monalisa Khan

Dr. Monalisa Khan, an Associate Professor of English, is currently working as the Deputy Director in the Directorate of Secondary & Higher Education (DSHE). Dr. Monalisa is the Member Secretary of the "Curriculum Coordination Cell" of DSHE working on the implementation of the new curriculum at the secondary level. She has been teaching English at Higher Secondary and Tertiary levels since 2005. She did her BA and MA in English from the University of Dhaka. She pursued her second Masters in English Language Teaching (ELT) at East West University, Dhaka. She received her PhD in Applied Linguistics and ELT from Jahangirnagar University on 'Teaching EFL Reading at the Higher Secondary Level of Education: Impact of Strategy Instruction on Learning Outcomes'. Professor Dr. Md. Zulfeqar Haider

Professor Dr. Md. Zulfeqar Haider has been working as an English teacher, teacher-trainer, curriculum and assessment specialist, and textbook writer for the government of Bangladesh for the last 30 years. He did his PhD in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) from Monash University, Australia where he did his MEd (TESOL) previously. Dr. Sayeedur Rahman

Dr. Sayeedur Rahman is a Professor and former Chairman of the Department of English Language at the Institute of Modern Languages (IML), University of Dhaka. He received PhD in ELT from Jawaharlal Nehru University, India, as an Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) Scholar. He has extensively worked as an ESL/EFL teacher and researcher for the last 20 years and has published widely in the areas of SLA and Sociolinguistics. He has worked as a consultant and led several ELT projects with Save the Children, the Open University-UK, UNICEF, Dhaka Ahsania Mission (DAM), British Council, and English in Action (EIA) project funded by the UK Government and Mott MacDonald. He was awarded the Researcher Links fellowship from the British Council, UK in 2014 as a Visiting Fellow with the OU, UK. He is also a certified Master Trainer by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Bangladesh, and the British Council Bangladesh. His research interests include sociolinguistics, EFL syllabus design and materials development, socio-psychological study of EFL, individual differences in language learning, and EAP/ESP.
